Message from Rev. Dr. Carl Heick

Dear Friends

I can always tell when Pastor Bruce has been in the office. Things seem to be just a bit more disordered, ever so slightly messy. Apparently he does not feel the same need for neat piles that I do. If I say something to him about it, he flashes me a look which clearly says "What's your problem?" I mention this because I just became aware of a new cultural phenomenon which had not been on my radar. Have you heard of Marie Kondo? She is a small, gracious Japanese lady who goes into people's homes and assists them with organizing their possessions and getting rid of those items which are never used and which do not "spark joy." She has written a book and has a current television series which is apparently all the rage.

Kondo writes, "Possessions that have a place where they belong and to which they are returned each day for a rest are more vibrant." My mother always used to say, "A place for everything and everything in it's place." Can anyone live such an ordered life? I'll tell you one thing. It is also the capacity to recognize the best gifts of God, name them, and give thanks.
