Message from Rev. Bruce Bardon Turn the Page

Wow! 2019! We close one chapter and begin a new one. 2018 was a tumultuous year; drama on the world stage, a toxic political climate and economic uncertainties domestically. How was it for you? Perhaps you experienced unexpected challenges. Wouldn't it be great if we could TURN the PAGE and have a start fresh? We're not the first people to live in difficult days. Life is often hard.

The Old Testament book of Lamentations was written during tough times. Jeremiah, the author, is sometimes referred to as the "weeping" prophet, a title he earned for the sadness that comes through in his writing. He witnessed, firsthand, the fall of Jerusalem to the Babylonians in 586 BC. He lived, and wrote, during difficult times and lived with the feeling that God had deserted his people.

Lamentations is a series of five poems, each independent, but closely aligned, outlining the troubling times. It is sometimes called the "saddest" book in the Bible. We see the agony of the nation through the experience of a single individual. In chapter three we read that Jeremiah experienced physical ailments (3:4), pain (3:11), jeering and taunts (3:14), anxiety (3:17), hopelessness (3:18), and discouragement (3:20).

Though Lamentations accurately portrays the suffering of the day, it gives hope that hard times CAN lead to spiritual maturity and new beginnings. C.S. Lewis wrote in The Problem of Pain, "God WHISPERS to us in our pleasures, SPEAKS in our conscience, but SHOUTS in our pain; it is his megaphone to rouse a deaf world."

In the middle of complaining about the bad things happening around him, the prophet begins to see the present predicament as an opportunity for a new start, as a chance to "TURN the PAGE" made possible because of a loving God. In Lamentations 3:22-24 we read "Because of the LORD's great love we are not consumed, for his compassions never fail. They are NEW every morning; great is your faithfulness. I say to myself, "The LORD is my portion; therefore, I will wait for him."

One of our great hymns is born out of this scripture. "Great Is Thy Faithfulness" was written by Thomas Obediah Chisholm in 1923. He wrote the lyrics of the song having experienced difficult times in his own life. He became a Christian at age 27 and entered the ministry at age 36. He was in poor health and was forced to step away from the ministry just a year later.

He eeked out a meager existence selling insurance but he had serious health issue throughout his life. He came to realize he had to rely not on his own strength but on God's faithfulness. And thus a great song of Christianity was born.
